

- suggesting that you come over to his office and see him. Is that correct?
- A. No sir. I came from the CO's office and reported to the guard room and from there I went into the cell and Miller sent over to the Sgt of the guard and asked me to come and see him. I was taken over to his office by Miller himself.
- Q. Was anybody else in the office?
- A. Only a Provost Officer.
- Q. Was he there all the time?
- A. He was in and out.
- Q. What happened?
- A. First of all he offered me a cigarette and I refused it and two or three minutes after he offered me another cigarette and told me to come clean. He said things in the statement which I never said.
- Q. Did he read it over to you?
- A. Yes sir. He had me sign the caution.
- Q. You signed twice?
- A. I signed them both together sir.
- Q. Did you say that (JA refers him to first para of his statement)?
- A. No, I didn't tell him that.
- Q. Did you tell him what is in the second para?
- A. No sir.
- Q. Did you tell him this (4th para)?
- A. Yes sir.
- Q. Did you tell him about this (3rd para)?
- A. No.
- Q. All that you said is this 4th para?
- A. Yes sir.
- Q. Where did he get the rest?
- A. I don't know.
- Q. You went in there, he gave you the caution and he just started typing. You told him the 4th para and he added the other paras and asked you to sign. Is that what happened?
- A. Yes sir.
- Q. Did he ask you where you had been that day?
- A. Yes sir.
- Q. Then other than the 4th para you never said anything and he just made up the rest of it?
- A. Yes sir.

Questions by the Prosecution

- Q. As you came from the CO's office to the guard room that morning did you see S/Sgt Miller?
- A. Yes. He was in the car.
- Q. How far away?
- A. About 15 feet.
