HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion santis in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, excepting 8 and 25, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide word homesteaded upon by any permanent of the propose of the section of the propose of the propose

ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the loca land office for the District in which the land to be taken in situate, or if the homestead're desirés he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ostawa, the Commissioner of Innuigration, Winnipes, or the Local Agen-tic the district in which the lands on the Commission of authority for some one entry for him. A few of #10 is charged for a homestead entry

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans:—

At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father for mother, if the father is deceased) or any person who is eligible to make a homestee the person who is eligible to make a homesteed property of the provisions of this land entered for by such person as a house stead, the requirements of this Act as to re-sidence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

13) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in themanner pre-scribed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by presidence upon the first homestead, as second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant o indicate the same township or an adjoining r cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 50 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Loval Agent, Sub-Agent or the state of the control of the notice in writing to the Commissions of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION
