On motion of Mr. Wyer.

Resolved, that a Committee be appointed to consider of the subject communicated to the House by Message from His Honor the President, of 23d February, relative to the Court of Chancery, and to report the same at the next Session of the General Assembly.

Ordered, that Mr. Parker, Mr. Chandler, and Mr. Johnston be a Committee for that

purpose.

A Message from His Majesty's Council.

Mr. Bliss, Master in Chancery, informed the House, that the Council had passed the following Resolution:

" COUNCIL CHAMBER, 2d MARCH, 1830.

On motion, Resolved, that the Journals of this House, from the first session thereof, be printed; and that in future the Journals of each Session be printed at the end thereof.

"And further Resolved, that the above be communicated to the House of Assembly, in order that they may make provision for carrying the same into effect."

A Bill to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue, for the services therein mentioned.

Resolved that the Bill do pass.

Ordered, that Mr. Ward take the said Bill to the Council, and desire their concurrence thereto.
