NATIONS MUST COME TO IT

Remarkable Prediction Made in Article in the Berlin Vorwaerts

London, June 22.—A remarkable prediction of early peace is contained in an article in the Vorwaerts, the official organ of the German socialist party. The greatest importance is attached to the article in view of the fact that it bassed the German censor despite the fact that it contains a propresy of an eleventh-hour world catastrophe, a prophecy couched n a scathing denunciation of the spirit of militarism and imperialsm which the Vorwaerts charges ed to the war. The article reads

"The Nationalists and Socialists are indeed right when they assert that the deeply rooted system of capitalism and imperialistic nationalism has embittered the industrial relations between the naions and the national groups to he utmost degree and finally led o the catastrophe of this world

"Experiences of the past can af ford us little hope of a peacefu development in the future bu what if this world catastrophe, t juote once more a striking phrase used by the Imperial Chancellorshould once more supply proof manswerable, serious proof,' tha imperialism with its last word world war, and with its militarist and imperialist methods has fail ed and should compel us not to further the development of these methods, but to find a new solu
