

ORANGE ORDER

Rev. Mr. Fish of Owen many cases he had met with, be Sound Delivered Address at Victoria Hall

A very interesting and instructive ecture was delivered by the Rev. H. Scotia. A. Fish of Owen Sound, Grand Chaplain of the Orange Association of British America. Ald. John H. Spence who officiated as chairman, introduced in a few well chosen words, the speaker of the evening Mr. Fish in opening his address on Rome in the Homes and Public Schools of Ontario," confined his remarks largely to the school question, drawing attention to the advances the Roman Catholics are making in some of the eastern counties, namely, Stormont, Russell, Prescott and Glengarry. Speaker said they had gradually secured a controlling interest in some of the Public schools and in one or two cases actually secured the schools and were running it under their own auspices but still retaining the government grant. In these places, however, after a number of affidavits had been secured by the provincial committee of association and submitted to the government(showing the Catholic customs and teachings in vogue in the said schools, the government threatened to withdraw the grant unless these customs were done away with and also to cancel the teachers' certificates unless they used them only in the capacity of Public school teachers. This, stated the speaker, was only a particular instance of what had been going on in many counties but which had been stopped in all places at the instance of the Orange association backed by the government.
