EACH COUNTRY WILL REGULATE ITS OWN TARIFF

Premier Asquith Announces Allies' Conference Will Not Touch That.

TARIFF WALL IS NEEDED

London, May 1 (Correspondence of the Associated Press).—The recent tariff agitation, growing out of the movement to cut off Germany's trade activities after the war has been checked by the announcement of Prime Minister Asquith in Parliament that the conference of the Allies going on at Paris would not deal with customs affairs, these being left for governmental action by each country.

It says: "With a tariff wall round the British Empire we shall be in a position to come to terms with our friends and to defend ourselves against our enemies. These questions are urgent and burning; they have been raised in a practical and pressing form by the exigencies of war. We believe it to be true that we must settle them or perish. "FRIGO" LIKED IN FRANCE

Cold Storage Beef Becomes Suddenly All the Rage.

Paris, May 1—"Frigo" as the French call American cold storage beef, has taken so well in France that its popularity has, for the time being, at least, defeated the purpose of its importation—that is to say, the raising of retail prices of meat. The Mayors of several suburban towns having expressed the wish to follow the example of their Parisian colleagues in setting up retail stores for the sale of refrigerated meat, were informed that they must go slow, as the imported article is rare. Many butchers who resisted its introduction as first a new selling it at the same prices as fresh meat; in some cases it has brought even more. The authorities are taking the matter up and propose to fix maximum retail prices.

DAMAGE FROM FIRE MORE THAN FROM FIGHTING

Dublin Has Assumed Appearance of City of Refugees.

FOOD SITUATION IS SERIOUS

City Now Surrounded, and a Permit Necessary to Get Through.

By Special Wire to the Courier. Kingstown, via London, May 1.—The food situation in Dublin is precarious. Thirty-four free food depots were opened on Sunday, stocked for the most part with food commandeered from various places by the military. The food is being doled out in tiny portions after a rigid examination into the necessities of the applicant. Food also is very short in Kingstown, and many of the necessities of life cannot be obtained at any price.

MILITARY PERMIT NECESSARY

A military permit now is necessary to pass through either the inner military cordon or the larger circle drawn around the city. The permit and the bearer invariably are subjected to close examination. Even a strictest watch is being maintained over persons desiring to take passage out of Ireland from Kingstown. Guards are posted at frequent intervals along every road in the country.

MUCH DAMAGE BY FIRE

The damage by fire is far greater than that from the fighting. The important work of the next few days will be the problem of providing for the people. Already the city has assumed the appearance of a town full of refugees. For a week no work has been done, and no work means no money for thousands whose existence depends on their daily earnings.

THE REBELS' PLAN

The military plan of the rebels was to seize and fortify the entire centre of the city, taking up outpost positions at various strategic points which would command the approaches. The idea would have been more successful but for the failure to hold Trinity College, with the result that the soldiers upon had a formidable force and a powerful stronghold in the midst of the rebels. Operating from this position the soldiers were able to split up the rebel forces, harry them and cut their communications. Machine guns were mounted to command the streets, compelling the rebels to keep underhand. In fact as soon as the military machine began to work smoothly, the rebels were reduced to sniping tactics.

More Candles Needed.

By Special Wire to the Courier. Washington, May 1.—War has increased the demand for church candles in Russia where a shortage of bees was for making them is reported by American consular officers.
