SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NOTES

WEST LAND NEGOTIATIONS
The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, who was at the commencement of the present war, and has since continued to be a British subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country, may homestead quarter-sections of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must be a resident of the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for District. Entry of land may be made on certain conditions. A settler after obtaining homestead patent, if he cannot secure a pre-emption, may take a quarter-section in certain districts. Price \$300 per acre. Must reside six months in each of three years. Holders of entries may count time of employment as farm labourers in Canada during 1917, as residence duties under certain conditions.

When Dominion Lands are advertised or posted for entry, returned soldiers who have served overseas and have been honourably discharged, receive one day priority in applying for entry at local Agents' Office (but not Sub-Agency). Discharge papers must be presented to Agent.

MILLIONAIRE DUPED BY FAIR PARIS MODEL

His Chauffeur In League With Mannequin, Samuel Slater's Hard Time SHACKLED IN A BARN Wealthy American Victim-ized For Third Time By Women's Wiles

For seven months, shackled by a dog collar and heavy chain in the barn of the French estate, which he had rented at the request of a Paris mannequin whom he intended to make his wife, kicked, beaten and starved into signing cheques for large amounts, the wealthy American millionaire, paid the price of his infatuation for the model. He was freed only when the rustic who had guarded him during that time, under the impression that he was a maniac, talked of his charge in the village while under the influence of liquor. In telling his story, however, the peasant embellished it with the statement that his prisoner was a German spy, and this aroused the interest of the superintendent of police, who searched the chateau and liberated the American.

Samuel Slater's life for many years had been one of almost fictional romance. He had been duped by a woman. More than two decades ago while walking through the great woolen mills of his brother at Webster, Mass., he met among the 1,200 girls employed there one who seemed to him to be above her surroundings. He took her away, educated her, and later they were married.
