Killed in Action

Recently more sad news came to Kentville when Mrs. Gerald Lechmere Ward received a cable from the British Admiralty, stating that her eldest son Surgeon Probationer N. Claude Ward F. N. V. R. had been killed on September 12th, 1918 at the age of 21 years.

After a successful medical course of one year at Dalhousie and three years at McGill Universities, he carried on the traditions of his family and race volunteered for the British Naval Service and was appointed Surgeon to a Destroyer. His father fought in the South African War his grandfather was a captain in the British Army, and for generations his ancestors have held commissions in the Imperial Army and Navy. Besides his mother he left to mourn their loss Ernestine wife of Harold M. Chase, Barrister, Evangeline sisters and one brother Reginald in the 10th Siege Battery and many relatives and friends. In quiet courage, chivalry gentleness and general quality of character he was a fine example of the Anglo Saxon spirit and culture of which we are proud as distinguished from the brutal "Kulture" of the treacherous Hun, and gave his life in doing his part to prevent the infliction of the latter upon humanity. Surely with such a character, and for such a cause to die is to live again forever in the brightness of the hereafter, and as long as life shall last in the memories of those nearest and dearest and of those who knew him best.
