Chosen for Moderator.

of the General Assembly, presided

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NEWS TOPICS OF A WEEK

JOHNSON'S AWFUL DEATH

A Terrible Gunning Accident on Saturday
on the Six Nations Reserve White
River Shooting.

Caledonia, Ont., June 14 - A most
dreadful accident occurred on the
Six Nations Reserve about 3 o'clock
yesterday afternoon, by which Mr.
Festus Johnson, one of the most
valuable members of the village of
White River, was instantly killed while
terribly mangled. The cause of the
disaster was as follows: Johnson was
discharging his gun. Yesterday the
No. 2 team of the Six Nations
League Match at Chawabonk Pond.
Mr. Johnson was a member of the team
yesterday afternoon, by which Mr.

TRAM AND COMMERCIAL.

British Imports from Canada in-
creased twelve per cent during May, while
the general imports declined four per
cent. During the five months of the
present year the imports from Canada
increased forty-three per cent.

Mr. William Saunders of Waterloo
ended his life at Fort Huron with a
dose of laudanum.

Alexander Patterson, a farmer in
Laurier township, committed suicide
by hanging himself in his barn.

POLICE - A MURDER.

The official nominations were taken
place in Ottawa last night. The candidates
being Mr. James Connor, Liberal, and
Mr. J. H. Metcalfe, Conservative. The
office of warden of Kingston Penitentiary
will be held by Mr. Metcalfe. The late
warden, Dr. Lavelle, has been retired
with an allowance of \$1400 per annum.

The four Johannesberg Reformers
paid the heavy fine of \$25,000 each,
and all exonerated from their previous
agreement to abstain from any inter-
ference in the politics of the South
African republic.

Dr. Jameson and his fellow pris-
oners who took part in the rebellion
in Rhodesia, were again imprisoned
at the Bow Street Police Court last
week. Four witnesses having arrived
from Africa. Interest has fallen out
in the case.

POLITICS - FOREIGN.

The first session of the 6th Congress
of the United States closed last week.
It is likely that Governor Morton of
New York will be offered the Republi-
can nomination for Vice President.

Mr. McKim, President of the Re-
publican National Committee, has
been elected to the office of Secretary.

Financially President Kruger has
done a great stroke of business in the
Transvaal. The firm which he has re-
ceived the job of Treasurer of the
Transvaal Republic is said to be worth
\$1,000,000.

Charles Silverthorn, an Indian, em-
ployed by a farmer near Waterloo,
was shot dead by a train engine on
Saturday last.

The British cruiser Bonaventure
lost seventy men by sunstroke while on a
voyage from Colombo to London.

Mr. Festus Johnson of the village of
White River, on the Six Nations Res-
erve, was shot dead by a train engine
while on his way to work yesterday
morning.

Francis Brown, who was ninety-
five years of age, was thrown from a
train near Toronto on Saturday.
He fell from the top of the train
and was killed. His death was
attributed to a fall from a train.

Mr. Gordon Brown, brother of the
late Hon. George Brown, and former
editor of the Globe, is dead at Que-
bec. He was 83 years of age.

Hon. D. A. Macdonald, ex-Lieut-
enant Governor of Ontario, was
elected to the Mackenzie Cabinet,
as Minister of Agriculture, on Friday
last.

John Simons, who was just died in
France, at the age of 32, was
called by his parents John Francis
Simons. He was a very bright boy,
and was a member of the Ontario
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CRIME AND CRIMINALS.

The Coroner's Jury at Victoria has
returned a verdict in the case of
the Rev. Dr. Johnson, who was shot
dead by a train engine. The jury
found that the driver of the train
was guilty of manslaughter. The
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
