The United States is really a marvellous country. Its governing bodfies have refused to ratify the peace treaty as it stands. This would not have been so surprising had the United States delegates at the Peace Conference had a full share in making and framing it. In fact more than any other great leader at the Conference it was President Wilson that the Senate turned down, and the whole thing is probably attributable to party politics. Some of the Senators will have no interference with European politics nor will they suffer America to be drawn into European affairs. It is nothing to them that a year ago over two million of the picked manhood of the country was in France, that thousands of young Americans left their bones there, and that the adventure cost millions of dollars. It was really to prevent the recurrence of such conditions as forced America into war that President Wilson insisted on the League of Nations pact being made apart of the peace treaty. Yet the Senate left the whole question in the air and the United States has yet to make peace with Germany. 


