The Officials Bagled -Efforts Made to Catch the Men in the States

Kingston, Aug. 31—The escaped convicts have not been recaptured. When they heard the shooting they threw themselves in the bottom of the boat and were safe there. A guard with a glass could see nothing but the hand of one who controlled the machine When the who controlled the machine when the prisoners would not surrender the alarmwas given. The fates seemed against the authorities. A tug could not be found in Kingston harbor. The Chieftain was finally secured at Garden I-land. Then attention was turned to Ports-mouth harbor, but, most unusual occurrence, not a tug nor steam yacht seemed to be in it. The asylum yacht Julian and the yacht Ripple were taken. Schoones was a man about 41 years of age, an Englishman, and committed to the penitentiary from Owen Sound for ten years for man-slaughter. John Kelley was from Welland, an Irishman, 30 years of age. He was an engineer by trade and had found his way into the penitentiary for burglary, for which he received five years and served two years. "Both men," said Warden Livell, "were well-behaved, industrious follows. They had not a mark against fellows. They had not a mark against them on the records." It is thought that the escape was premeditated, and that the fellows had planned it to a nicety. Up to the present writing the convicts have not been heard of. Penitentiary officers have gone down the so uth shore in search of them.


