THE members of the St. Andrew's Church Musical Association are all, without excepception, expected to attend the special practice to take place this evening, at 8.30, in the basement.

Information reaches us from Portugal Cove of the very distressed circumstances of about sixty families there, which comprise about onethird the population of the settlement. A personal visitation of their habitations, our informant assures us, shows that that large number of about three hundred persons are without the necessaries of life except one article only-potatoes-and upon these they have been living for several weeks past. Flour, bread, butter, pork, tea and molasses-of these they are entirely destitute. The Poor Commissioner's deputy, Mr. Dunphy, has visited the place, but the relief afforded upon his recommendation has been so inconsiderable as to scarcely touch the most pressing wants. There is also need of some relief in Torbay; to a few families in Outercove, and to some in the Cape St. Francis settlements; but in none of these is the aggregate of suffering so great, proportionately, as in Portugal Cove.


