The reason is that we have no College or Seminary n the Diocese for the education es ecially of subjects for the priesthood. Many years ago the late Illustrious Bishop Mullock made an effort to ound such a Seminary, when he opened St. Bonaventure's College, and im nediately several young students were prepared for the priesthood and became Missioners in their native councurrent of the Educational stream eemed to take a more secular trend t appears, however, that the time is gain approaching when a new in ering of the Ecclesiastical Vocations nd, in the not distant future, we may ope to see this Diocese assuming its roper place among the Churches of Catholic fold by having her own an Seminary.
