## Motor Boat Turns Somersault in Race at Hudson.

Dr. Kent and Companion Have Thrilling Experience in Race.

Hudson Heights, August 31.—An accident of a most sensational nature occurred at Hudson Heights on Saturday afternoon when the motor-boat Joval, owned by Dr. Kent of St. Anne de Bellevue, turned a complete somersault while going at a speed of twenty-eight miles an hour, throwing the driver, Mr. W. E. Baker, and the mechanic many feet in the air. With the nearest boat a mile away, the men in the water were soon in desperate straits and, when finally rescued, lost consciousness at once.

The Joval, driven by W. E. Baker, agent of the Vankleek factory of Detroit, assisted by one of the mechanics of the company, was racing Mr. Luther's Marie II, over a twenty-mile course and was over a mile ahead when, for some reason unknown, the boat turned completely over while going at top speed, and sank within thirty seconds. Both men were fortunately thrown clear of the boat, but it was some time before they could be rescued.

The Marie II was unable to turn until it had passed three or four miles farther along the course, but meanwhile Mr. C. M. McCuaig and Mr. Percy Mason, his mechanic, who were taking part in another race and were two miles away from the scene of the accident, had reached the spot and, owing to the difficulty of approaching in the swell, threw a line to the exhausted swimmers, whose strength had almost given out. Rescue by this method proving difficult, Mr. Mason, tied the rope around his waist and jumped into the water, and was successful in helping the two men into the boat, where they collapsed immediately and were taken to the Hudson Heights boat house where they recovered from their exposure.
