"Under present existing conditions," said Mr. Woodbridge yesterday, "most paper matures in October. This necessitates a general rush on the part of the growers of grain to get their rops to market as early as possible. There can be no choice either in marketing price or season for handling. They must sell and be prepared to meet their obligations. Of course, in years of failure it is possible to sometimes get extensions on mortgages, but in a majority of cases the machinery houses demand immediate settlement. rybody is then ready to ship at , and the railroads are taxed beyond their capacity to move the crop.
