Than One Cent on the Dollar

New York, Dec. 30 .- A decree has been signed by Justice Gaynor in spe-cial term of the Supreme Court, held for the County of Richmond at the King's County Court House, in King's County Court House, in Brooklyn, authorizing David Bennett King, assignee of the estate of Erastus Wiman, to make a final settlement with the creditors of Mr. Wiman, as far as the assets in the assignee's hands are concerned. These assets consist of various stocks and bonds, which have been reduced to available funds, the assignee realizing thereby \$8,380.70. After dedupting expenses, fees and commissioners. ing thereby \$8,380.70. After deducting expenses, fees and commissioners, there remains \$6,658.70 to be divided among 63 creditors, whose claims aggregate a little more than \$913,000. They will each get about 68-100 of a cent on the dollar. Before Mr. Wiman made his assignment he had transferred to Mr. King, as trustee, for the benefit of his creditors, all his Staten Island real estate, except his home. These assets remain to be
