WANT JAPS EXCLUDED

Butchers' Union Will Demand That United States Keep Them Out.

Chicago, Oct. 29. — The invasion of the American industrial field by Janu-

ce American laborers is shared by President Michael Donnelly, of the Butcher Workmen's Union. Twenty-One Entombed In Coal Mine Acci

Trinidad, Col., Oct. 29. — Coroner E. B. Sipe has begun an inquiry into the fatal explosion, which occurred yesterday afternoon in Tercio Mine, No. 3, owned by the Rocky Mountain Coal & Iron Co.
