

Geneva, June 20.-It is possible that the bodies of the six Alpine climbers, including the American, Randall, who were killed at Mont Blanc in 1870 will shortly be given up by the natural movement of the Glacier des Bessons, movement of the Glacier des Bessons, upon which they perished.

The party consisted of eleven, Five were found, including Dr. Bean, of Baltimore. Others were supposed to have fallen into a crevasse and have not been seen since. Recently a broken alpenstock with Dr. Bean's name carved upon it has been found near the mouth of the glacier, indicating that the belies was etched.
