Charge Made Against German Consul and Secretary At Seattle.

GET NOTICES OF ARREST

Employee Says He Agreed To Give Information For \$1,000.

[Canadian Press.]

SEATTLE, Wash., March 17 .-- Dr. William Muller, imperial German consul at Seattle, and his secretary, B. M. Schulz, were served with notice of arrest today at the consulate. They are charged with conspiracy in an attempt to corruptly influence an employee of the Seattle Drydock and Construction Company, named Murdock, by inducing him to sell secrets of his employers.

Consul Muller and his secretary are accused by the State of Washington of offering Murdock a cash consideration to supply them with information bearing out Ambassador Bernstorff's charges, that the Seattle corporation was shipping knocked down submarines to the

The information against the German representatives, filed by Alfred H. Lundin, county prose-cuting attorney, jointly charges them and Dan Tarnisasky, a free lance detective, with conspiracy, Muller Makes Denial.

Consul Muller denied, tonight, that he had any agreement with Murdock or the detective to purchase anything, nor did he arrange to have them steal papers from the construction company. He declared that Tarnisasky approached him with a statement that he had information that submarines were being built here for the British navy, but that he had dealt with the detective only so far as was necessary to determine whether there was any truth in the report. The colonel expressed confidence in a prompt dismissal of the charge

against him. Murdock and the detective were arrested last night on a joint grand larceny complaint. The warrants for the arrest of Consul Muller and his secretary were served through

Murdock to Get \$1,000.
In a statement said to have been made to the prosecuting attorney, Murdock said the negotiations for the delivery of information said to have been sought by Consul Muller were still pending when he was arrested. He had originally demanded \$1,500, he said, but later agreed to accept \$1,000. 
