ALLIES ASSERT RIGHT TO SEIZE THE MAILS

[Canadian Press.] Washington, April 3.—The reply of all the Entente Allies to the American protests against mail seizures was presented today to the state department. Denial is made that any treaty rights of the United States have been violated, the Allies re-assert their jurisdiction in mail in territories, and the right to exclude contraband. Additional will be made simultaneously in Washington, London and Paris.
