A sufficient number of councillors expressed themselves favorable to this move last evening. It is claimed that the city solicitor has already gone on record as being ready to stand behind the council in the move.

At last night's regular meeting of the city council Ald. George Wenige moved and Ald. Frank E. Harley seconded a resolution that the city solicitor be instructed to seize the cars of the street railway company and retain the same until such time as the city is paid in full, subject to the approval of the city solicitor. It is proposed to man the cars and operate them until the required amount is secured.
