SEIZE WHISKEY LEFT IN GARAGE

Brantford Police Locate Stock of Twenty-One Cases Near Belmont Hotel.

Charles Robson Charged With Breach of Public Health Act.

BRANTFORD, May 7.—While P. C. Burkyne was wending his way around his beat on Friday evening he casually looked into the garage of the Belmont Hotel, owned by William Fraser, and espied a suspicious looking pile of cases. Upon a close examination he found that it was 21 cases of assorted whiskeys. He at once called the police station and informed Acting Chief Donnelly of his find, who at once responded to the call and seized the liquor. Police officials state that Mr. Fraser will be charged with a breach of the O. T. A. in the police court in the near future, and decline to discuss the case.

It is alleged that the liquor was the property of some of the ball players, and that they were storing it in the garage.

Charles Robson, a farmer, was charged yesterday with a breach of the public health act in the police court, County Constable William Taylor having reported that a large horse, dead, had been found on Robson's farm, right near the river, opposite Slingsby's, and that the carcass had not been buried. The farmer explained that the animal was not his, and that it must have been carried there by the flood.

In remanding the case, Magistrate Blake said that County Constable Taylor had proven his case, and that it was now up to the farmer to make a successful defence. So that the farmer could bring witnesses, and prove that the horse was not his, the remand was made until next Wednesday.

Robson was ordered to bury the dead quadruped by the court. He promised to do. He is to tell that it has been done when he appears next Wednesday.

REPORTS SEEDING WELL ADVANCED

WINNIPEG, May 7.—With ideal weather conditions, wheat seeding in Southern Manitoba has been completed, it was said tonight by J. H. Evans, deputy minister of agriculture. Farmers in the southern part of the province are well on with their oat seeding, he added. Wheat seeding is not so far advanced in the northern districts, but is proceeding satisfactorily, Mr. Evans stated.

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
