Gratifying Increase in
Population.

Ottawa, Oct. 20.—The population of
towns in New Brunswick, Nova Scotia
and Prince Edward Island according
to the 1921 census follow:

New Brunswick.
Bathurst, 1921, 3,581; 1911, 960;
increase 2,621 per cent.
Campbellton, 1921, 5,569; 1911, 3,
817; increase 45.90 per cent.
Chatham, 1921, 4,489; 1911, 4,666;
decrease 3.79 per cent.
Edmundston, 1921, 4,088; 1911, 1,
821; increase 124.67 per cent.
Newcastle, 1921, 3,519; 1911, 2,
945; increase 19.19 per cent.
Sussex, 1921, 2,198; 1911, 1,906; in-
crease 15.32 per cent.
Woodstock, 1921, 3,377; 1911, 3,856;
decrease 12.42 per cent.
