Owing to the unsettled state of finances, so far only on Australian Government, that of New South Wales, had responded, but it granted £10,000 sterling annually. A monthly service, with two steamers, was at once established and ran with the unprecedented speed for such a journey of 14 knots an hour.

He wanted some system by which the exports of Canada to Australia might be made known, as the figures did Canada harm. The principal advantages would be the quick exchange of fruits, the magnificent fish of which Australia has none, of wool and of Canadian manufactures. 
