BROOKE COUNCIL,

Inwood, Aug. 30, 1919. Council met pursuant to adjournment. Members all present. Minutes of former meeting read and on motion of Sutton-Campbell were

Report of Geo. A. McCubbin, O. L. S. & C. E., read, on proposed repairs to the Moffatt-Lucas Award drain under The Municipal Drainage Act. A number of the interested taxpayers were present and opposed the repairing of the drain under the Municipal Drainage Act. Mr. John Bourne and F. E. Lovell withdrew their names from the petition.

Engineer's report on the proposed repair of the Davidson Award drain under The Municipal Drainage Act was read. A number of those interested in said drain were present at the reading of the report.

Sutton-Campbell-that report of Geo. A. McCubbin, O. L. S. & C. E., on the proposed repairs to the Davidson Award Drain under The Munici pal Drainage Act be adopted and by law be prepared authorizing the work and loan, and that the report on the proposed repairs to Moffatt-Lucas Drain be abandoned as the names remaining on the petition does not represent a sufficient number of owners within the area described, and that the costs be charged pro rata in accordance with Section 20 of the Municipal Drainage Act and entered upon the Collector's Roll of 1919 for collection.—Carried.

Communication received and read from the Ontario Department of Education, directing the Council's attention to "The School Attendance Act, 1919."

Sutton-Campbell, that clerk notify J. P. Cowels, Provinctal School Attendance Officer to meet the Council at their next meeting to explain the objects, operation and the means

of inforcement of the Act.-Carried. Communication received and read from A. I. McKinlay on behalf of Archy Monro and Dugald Camptell, with reference to the construction of the McIntyre-Zavitz Drain. They also ask Council to proceed at once with the repair and improvement to the 3-4 Sideroad and 8-9 Concession Drains in accordance with the settlement made with Campbell et al at the time of the Monro Drain appeal.

From Moncrieff & Wilson asking that the work of repair to the Monro drain must desist or else proceed at once to erect a dam in accordance with the undertaking and to repair the 3 and 4 Sideroad Drain.

Petition received and signed by 67 ratepayers asking that Council open up and make fit for travel, that portion of the Blind line between the 5th and 6th Concessions of the Township of Brooke, from the east side of Lot 4 to the Sideroad between Lots 9 and 10.

Campbell-Loosemore, that Reeve. Deputy Reeve and Atkin be a committee to look over the proposition and report at next meeting, of the Council.—Carried.

Mr. Clayton Johnston submitted the names of Herman Atkin and Geo Vosburg as his bondsmen as tax collector.

Sutton-Campbell, that names submitted be accepted and Clerk see to the execution of the bond.—Car. Athin-Campbell, that Townshi; furnish tile to drain the McVicar gravel pit, County Road Supt., agree-

ing to put the same in. - Carried. Tenders received and opened for the following drain debentures, viz: Monro Drain; McIntyre-Zavitz and Brooke & Euphemia Townline and

Bryan-Johnston Drains. Sutton-Loosemore, that tender of Malcolm Campbell be accepted for the Monro drain, Miss Gladys Shrapnell for the McIntyre-Zavitz drain and Edward Stater for the Brooke and Euphemia Townline and Bryan-

Johnston drain.—Carried. Loosemore-Campbell, that Pathmasters not returning Road Lists by Oct. 1st, 1919, Clerk put the same on Collector's roll as unperformed

Statute Labor. - Carried. Atkin-Sutton, that Amos Kelly be paid \$25.00 for one sheep killed by dogs. - Carried.

C. L. Taylor, M. H. O., for the Township of Brooke tendered his resignation, as he intended leaving the Township before the end of the

year. Sutton-Loosemore, that resigna tion of Dr. Taylor be accepted with regret and that Br. McLean be appointed M. H. O., and W. R. Dawson a member of the Board.-Carried.

E. Loosemore to be Commissioner and to serve bylaws.-Carried.

Brooke Municipal Telephone System asked for \$630 be advanced for Telephone purposes. Granted on motion of Sutton—Atkin.
