The District Exhibition is now only a few weeks ahead. We trust no legitimate means will be spared by the committee of arrangements to make it a general one throughout both counties. In 1882 the Kings County farmers did not make the display that was expected of them, and, therefore, with the exception of a few enterprising gentlemen from that county, the prizes were solely left to the competition of our own farmers. This apathy on the part of our friends in the other half of the district practically nullifies the grant as far as they are concerned. Competition in agriculture, no less than in commerce, infuses life, and the time and money that is spent by farmers in attending exhibitions are never lost. More or less an always is derived from the noblest of motives. Without a doubt, the noble counties of Kings and Annapolis - than which there are no finer in the world - should combine their forces and show just what they can do. The prizes to be sought for may not be large enough to be a very strong inducement; but money is not the only thing to be considered. An exhibition of the horse, cattle, sheep, fruit and produce of the farm, generally, such as Kings and Annapolis Counties could really show if every farmer would strive to do his best, would, we venture to say, be a better advertisement for this valley than any other means we could adopt. It would be simply a magnificent display; but, if it is left to this county alone, to the comparatively few even here who show necessary enterprise and ambition, all the prizes, at least, deserve reward. It will cause the exhibition to dwindle into a comparatively local affair and will be really an injury to the valley, should any considerable number of strangers visit it. Kings County should remember that she shares equally in whatever is won or lost, as far as outside opinion is concerned, and should act so that she at least, cannot be blamed. We have understood with pleasure, that a far more interested feeling exists among our neighboring agriculturists this year than in 1882 and we trust we have no doubt that the efforts they do not put forth the efforts they are capable of, by any means. The representation should be larger and more complete. Nearly every farmer can enter into some class of the prize list for competition, and the exhibits on a part of potatoes and half-bushel sorts of apples, they would all help in the aggregate. Let the individual pride that every inhabitant of this valley should feel, assert itself, and we will have an exhibition worthy the garden of Nova Scotia.

We notice there is being made an effort to have United States silver money circulated at its present face value in some portions of the Maritime Provinces, where such specie is not readily obtained. We have no objection to a big pile of American money, and think we could worry through with the inflation, but we advise our people to keep American silver for a while longer, at least, at the usual discount. In the United States, we would have difficulty in passing even our Dominion notes at the face, although, the U.S. greenback freely pass current among us, except with the bank and railroad companies who tax them a cent on the dollar. We suppose they know their own business best, but we fail to understand why this is done; because, as far as genuine United States greenbacks as any bank are concerned, they are really safer than notes of our Dominion banks, as the United States treasury guarantees their payment. With silver however, it is different, the par value of that kind of money is not the same as that of a little fiddle, and besides, the banks and railroads are not likely to lower the present rate of 20 per cent. discount. These two objections alone are serious ones, and while there are advantages to be urged, yet we think on the whole, we had better continue to accept the money in question only at a discount.

The two leading Halifax papers the Chronicle and Herald, are at present engaged in a controversy that is growing tiresome. They are making as much fuss over the by-election of a member for the Local Government in Halifax County, as if the present and future welfare of the Dominion hung on the issue. Double-headed columns of denunciations of his opponent, may be intensely interesting to the writers and the two gentlemen immediately concerned, but the bulk of readers would prefer more entertaining literature.

The Montreal Witness furnishes the following account of a curious drift of ice from the north Atlantic ocean for the month of August, prepared by the Hydrographic Office of the United States, is especially interesting, as it contains the record of the most remarkable drift since the record of January last. The "River" was wrecked off Cape Hatteras on the 6th February the wreck was sighted four hundred miles west of the coast of the place where she abandoned, although at that point she had gone completely across the Gulf Stream. Since the time she was first sighted she had been on five times, her course of drift within well prescribed limits, but since the fourteenth of June the wreck has commenced to work westward, almost dead in the teeth of the Gulf Stream, and on July 13th she was but about 50 miles to the south of where she was discovered. In a portion of the ocean where a steady equatorial current is said to flow, which would have carried her westward, almost in the face of prevailing winds as well as currents. The portion of the ocean in which she is now is now quite restricted, and is all south of the fifth degree of north latitude, but there is no diminution of the number of floating wrecks, there being no less than twelve on hand, and a wreck that was in an especially bad locality was a steamer from the United States torpedo vessel last month.

The President of the Sewing Circle in connection with St. James Church, Nova Scotia, announces the sale by auction of 25 head of short horn Durham cattle on his herd. They are to be disposed of in Halifax, to-day, on Monday, the 19th inst., at 10 o'clock, and twelve cows and heifers.

A dead body, supposed to be that of Thomas Long, missing from schooner as reported in our columns a short time ago, was found floating in the water, near Victoria Bridge, on the 3rd inst., by two men named Chas. Thomas and Benjamin Rice. With the aid of a line the body was towed ashore.

The "Canadian Gazette" of July 24th published in London, Eng. says that the new Canadian Government bill, 10 per cent scrip is now quoted at par. This is the first time since the Government parted with these securities a few months ago.

A London despatch of the 10th inst., says:—The British brig Belle Star, Captain Holdsworth, from Bar River, N. S., has been arrested in Charlottetown by order of the Admiralty, on suspicion of having recovered damages for the loss of the British brig Richard Owen, which was sunk by a collision with the Belle Star.

The weather of the past week has not shown any marked signs of improvement. Mr. Cogswell, of Halifax, who is a reliable authority on the weather, says the continued wet weather has been caused by the wind blowing against the sun back again, and we may eventually expect as continued a period of fine weather, when the wind shifts to the opposite points of the compass.

Immense quantities of mackerel are about our coast especially in St. Mary's Bay. Large numbers of very fine fish are being taken with the hook.—Courier.

Appos of the above, we may say that Mr. Alfred Ellis, traveller for Messrs Daniel and Boyd, of St. John, N. B., was in company with one or two others, one night last week in St. Mary's Bay, caught four barrels and a half of mackerel.

Mr. A. P. Robbs, of Clarence, says:—I grafted a plum tree last April, setting two grafted in a stalk one inch in diameter. Only one shoot took, having three buds, and to-day I measured the growth of these three shoots. The longest is 5 feet, the next 4 feet 3 inches, and the third 3 feet 11 inches, making an aggregate growth of 13 feet 2 inches. Who among the readers of your valuable paper, can beat this, either in the growth of one shoot, or in the aggregate growth of one, or of one set of shoots? As the shoots will have two months or more, yet to grow I will send you an account later on, mean time, brother farmers, trot out your prodigies!

Advice from Lunenburg to the Boston Fish Bureau state that the fisheries of that part of the Nova Scotia coast are the largest in the world. It is thought by millions across the best of fish rivers, and by setting lobster traps in the shallow bays; as previous times they never failed. On this part of the coast there is at present neither fish nor bait. No mackerel herring, or salmon caught at Margaree Bay. I have for the past ten days, and few previous. The Lunenburg fleet of Grand Bankers are doing well; each Marcellus the largest banker from that port, arrived at St. John's Newfoundland, the 21st with 2000 quintals of cod. The 5-buffers of the West Labrador coast, down to Belle Isle, have proved a total failure. Magdalen Island vessels have all returned from Lunenburg all west north. The last part of June mackerel were seen, for two days only, at the West entrance of Straits of Belle Isle; none caught. Reports from the North Bay cod fishery are favorable—last and cod scarce. A light catch on Quevretus Banks.

—The Summit House at Bar Harbor was burned on the 2nd inst., and the guests are now living in tents.

—The first through train on the Canada Pacific railway between Montreal and Chicago, via Ottawa and Toronto, passed through Ottawa on Monday.

—Miss May B. Hall, of Lawrencetown, was on a fall blown past blossom plucked from a tree in Mr. John Hall's orchard at Lawrencetown, on the 8th inst.

—The British force in Egypt, now numbering 3,000 men, will be raised to 10,000, in view of the intention to send an expedition to Khartoum to relieve Gen. Gordon.

—A correspondent of the *Times* says:—Rev. E. B. Moore entered on his pastorate in Avondale some weeks since. His services in the pulpit are greatly appreciated, while outsiders are delighted with his social qualities.

—Dennis Costigan, who while furiously driving on King Street, St. John, was shot by a constable (Fred Hayes), has been committed for trial. He was afterwards released on bail, himself in \$4,000 and three sureties for \$400 more.
