and the pupils vote by ballot. Those receiving the highest numbor of votes are elected to the office. After some of the "parliamentary rules" have become familiar to the school, the teacher can leave the chair and let the sehool organize itself, appointing a chairman and secretary and then attending to the business before it.-From the School Journal.
