So much on this greaily misrepreented subject, in simple justice to he Roman Catholic Church. It is difcult to believe that an institution which bs produced a Fenelon and a Bossonet In be radically bad; or that its docines and practices are, in the main, inpasistent with tise loitiest reazon and emust exalted piety.
