If the church itself was a mission, there could be no jealousy between the Home and Foreign parts of it, and there could be no proof for the common, shallow saying that Foreign Missions stole away the hearts of the people from home The prophets were the seers of Foreign Missions, and yet they were grand Home Missionaries dealing with the sins of nations and pointing to their remedies. The result of Foreign Missions had been only to increase Home Missions. Missions to the heathen had been proved, instead of checking the Home Mission, to be the real parent of it and its supporter. The mission to the heathen had to struggle against the prejudices and open hostility of Christian people, but the Home Mission was welcomed with sympathy, because it pointed to evils everyone could see, and the sphere of it lay at their own doors, the inter-est in Foreign Missions was therefore never likely to encroach upon it.
