death was found at autopsy to have been due to hæmorrhagic pancreatitis.

A man who, with symptoms of flatulent dyspepsia, vomiting and loss of weight, had a resistant mass in the region of the pylorus. Everything pointed to the existence of carcinoma as a grave possibility. Three months later, however, he had improved in health, when the mass found be more readily examined and was found to be broad and smooth, with a sharply defined liver-like edge and which was undoubtedly an accessory lobe. The man subsequently completely regained his health.
