Mercantile Summary.

THE retail grocers of London, Ont., wish to organize.

THE total assessment of the city of Belleville is this year \$3,969,488; an increase of \$55,505 over last year.

OWNERS of factories, tug-boats and other steamers feel severely the scarcity of coal caused by the Springhill strike. There is no change in the situation at Springhill.

R. T. DINAHAN, grocer, has assigned at the demand of Mr. George Lanctot, with liabilities of about \$6,000. The largest creditor is Mr. Lanctot himself, interested for \$3,000.

A MOVEMENT is on foot to form a world-wide alliance of dock laborers, lumber-handlers, freight hands, and longshoremen. It is started by the leaders of the famous dock-handlers' strike of London, Liverpool and Belfast.

THE partnership between Patrick Buckley and John Brockbank, as hardware dealers at Paris, Ont., was dissolved on the 16th ult. Mr. Buckley continues, assuming liabilities and collecting accounts.

It is said that Messrs. W. Conner and D. Davidson, of Mount Forest, have purchased a dry goods stock in Guelph, and intend removing to the Royal City as soon as the Mount Forest business can be wound up.

Mercantile Summary.

BELLEVILLE is agitating for rolling mills, it appears, and to that end proposes to advertise in iron papers, offering bonus inducements. The council of the Board of Trade has passed a resolution, too, favoring the erection of a big hotel in Belleville.

THE announcement is made in the New Brunswick *Royal Gazette* of the formation of the Fredericton Soap Company, capital \$10,000. Walter McFarlane, John M. Wiley, James A. Vanwart, Alfred Haines, Fred. P. Thompson and others, of York county, are the incorporators.

THE *Ottawa Journal* tells of the departure from that city of Mr. F. Bebbington, real estate and house agent. Last week his dwelling was in charge of a bailiff, and his effects have been sold at auction, realizing \$400. But there are claims for hundreds of dollars more than this will cover.

REFERRING to our report of last week concerning the failure of E. O'Reilly, of Aylmer, Que., the figures of liabilities were transposed, and should have read \$41,000, instead of \$14,000, making a very material difference. Apart from this, it is stated, he holds a dower claim of \$25,000. He claims assets of \$62,000, but very largely depreciable. His creditors have proposed that he pay 75 cents in the dollar, satisfactorily secured.

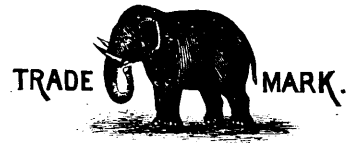

Mercantile Summary.

A DISSOLUTION, by mutual consent, is announced by the Montreal stationery and book-binding firm of Morton, Phillips & Bulmer. The partnership hitherto existing between Messrs. Henry Morton, Charles Samuel John Phillips and Thomas Campbell Bulmer, as stationers and bookbinders, under the name of Morton, Phillips & Bulmer, has been dissolved by mutual consent. A new firm is formed, we are told, consisting of Messrs. Henry Morton, Charles Samuel John Phillips, Hugh Cameron, Major Freeman, and Robert James Gibson, to continue the same business under the name of Morton, Phillips & Co.

THE failure is announced of W. & G. H. Tate, shipbuilders and dry dock men of Montreal, they having assigned upon demand last week. The firm has been pressed for active means for some time past, but it has been claimed to have a considerable apparent surplus. They owe the sum of \$86,147. —W. H. Arnton, auctioneer and commission merchant in the same city, has assigned. He owes the very considerable sum of \$32,787, an amount of liabilities difficult to account for, for one in his line of business. —A young man of only recent establishment in the paint and hardware trade in Montreal, Alex. Chaput, has just assigned upon the demand of Messrs. P. D. Dods & Co.; liabilities \$3,144. —Adolphe Kelsen, a Montreal tailor, has just assigned at the demand of H. Shorey & Co. Liabilities are \$6,118.
