

AMBASSADORS AND HIGH COMMISSIONERS POSTED ABROAD

This posting season 20 Heads of Post have been named so far. The first six were mentioned in the last issue of *Liaison* — Claude Charland, Italy; André Couvrette, Greece; Louise Frechette, Argentina; Tony Halliday, Chicago; Joan Winsler, Los Angeles; and Lloyd Francis, Portugal.

On June 28 and July 5 another 14 were named as follows:

Algeria: François Pouliot — taught at the Accra Academy in Ghana in 1964, served with CUSO in Uganda, Rwanda and Burundi in 1966, joined CIDA in 1971 and since 1981 has been Vice-President, Francophone Africa.

Bangladesh: Anthony G. Vincent — joined the Department in 1969 and has served in The Hague and New Delhi. Since 1983 he has been Director, South and Southeast Asia Relations Division.

Ecuador: Archie D. McArthur — has served in Mexico, Islamabad, Dublin, Los Angeles and as Chargé d'Affaires and Consul in Guatemala. Since 1984 he has been Senior Advisor and Co-ordinator, International Trade Development Branch.

Egypt: Marc Perron — has served in Paris, Brussels, Yaoundé and as Ambassador to Senegal. Since 1982, he has been Director General, Personnel Operations Bureau.
