

The Corporation, as the federal housing agency, gives planning advice to other Federal Government departments and agencies, as well as co-operating with provincial governments and with private firms engaged in housing development.

In addition to the planning of new communities sponsored by Federal Government agencies, such as Beeg Liver, Ont., the low cost workers of Atomic Energy of Canada Limited, interesting work has also been done by private firms. A good example is the Don Mills community built on a 2,200 acre site on the northwestern outskirts of Toronto. When completed it will be a planned community of 25,000 people with its own industrial and commercial centres. The project is being undertaken by private firm. Similar examples can be found in the Toronto and Montreal areas as well as in other parts of Canada.
