STATEMENT BY MR. SPEAKER

MR. SPEAKER: I indicated to honourable Members yesterday that I would review the points of order which were put forward in connection with questions asked during the question period on the subject of the budget.

I have looked over the records of past Parliaments and I find that they are of no more assistance than the arguments which were put forward yesterday. The fact is that in the past there has been a restriction against anticipating orders of the day in the question period. However, during the budget debate and during the debate on the Address there has been a relaxation of the rule, which perhaps gives me guidance along the lines that I ought to permit questions but govern them with some sort of restriction so as not to allow them to monopolize the question period. That point of view has been pronounced before and I shall try to permit a reasonable number of questions on budget topics.

Mr. Smith (Saint-Jean), from the Standing Committee on Agriculture, presented the Eighth Report of the Committee, which is as follows:
