MR. JAMES NICHOLAS

Mr. Gilbert Parent (Welland—St. Catharines—Thorold): Mr. Speaker, I ask you and my colleagues in this House to join me in acclaiming Mr. James Nicholas of Welland, Ontario, who has brought honour to Canada by being elected as the International Secretary of the World Council for Global Co-operation. He was the principal founder of this organization that was established in Toronto in November, 1988.

Some of the world's greatest minds have lent their support to Mr. Nicholas. Eleven Nobel prize winners from ten countries now serve as directors and patrons of the World Council.

The World Council is a follow-up to An Appeal For Peace which was written by Mr. James Nicholas and addressed to the youth of the developed world in 1984. The appeal was endorsed by 66 Nobel Laureates from 20 countries. Mr. Nicholson presented the appeal to Mr. Javier Perez de Cuellar, the Secretary-General of the United Nations. Inspired by his words of commendation, the World Council was formally established. Among those present at the founding convention were members of the diplomatic corps from 17 different countries. They represented more than half of humanity.

The Prime Minister of Canada was represented by Senator Richard Doyle. To date 17 international organizations from 15 countries have affiliated themselves with the World Council.

Internationally, Mr. Nicholas' efforts have been successful because his labours have been interpreted as an important Canadian initiative for peace.
