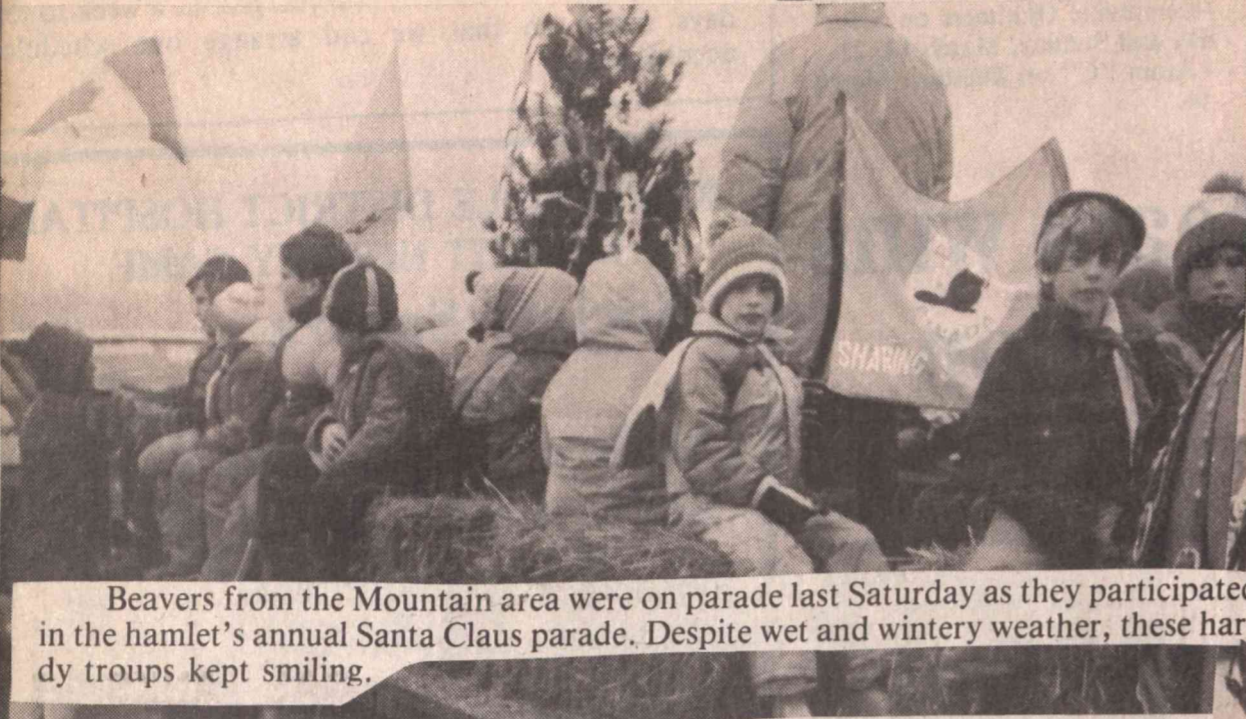
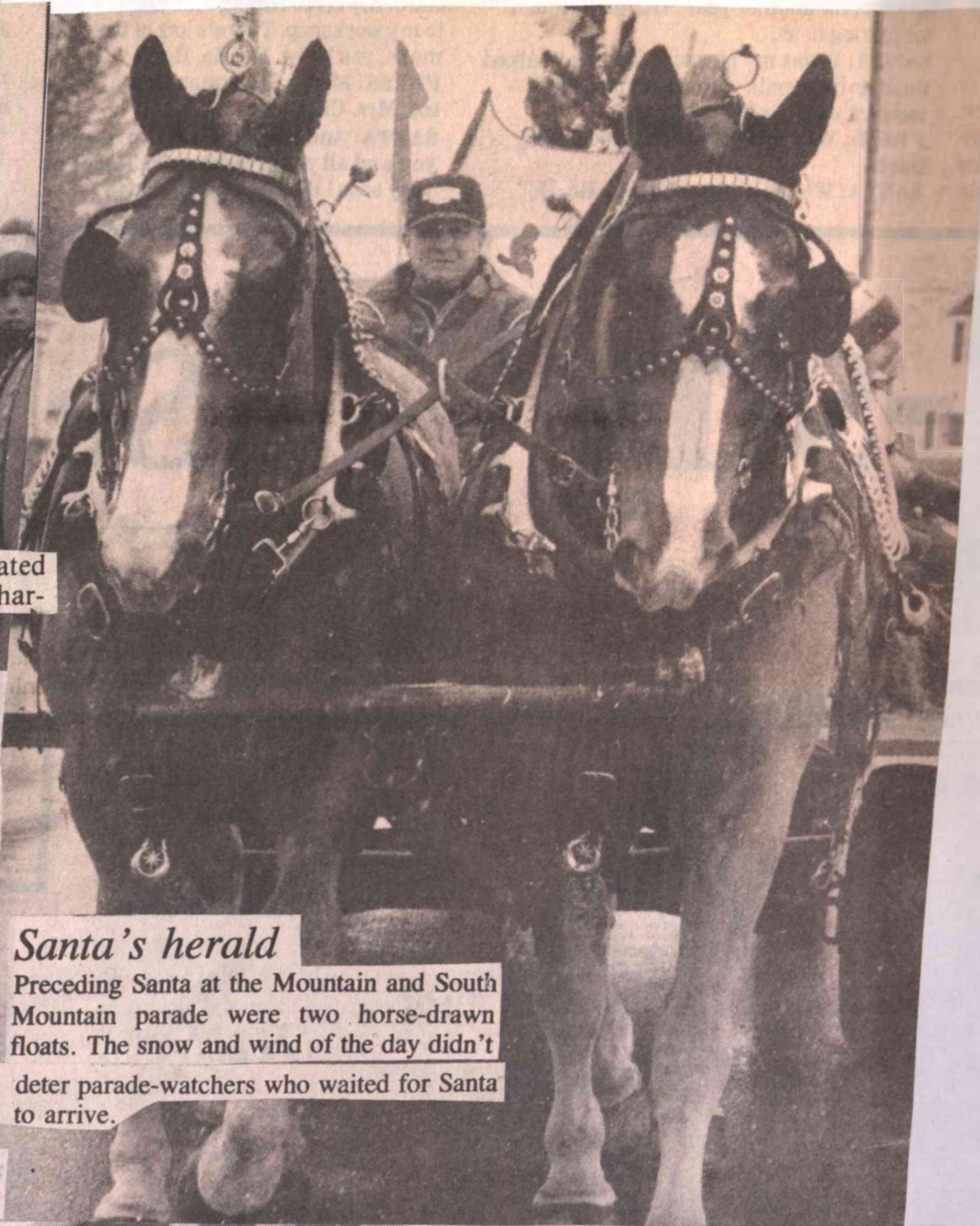


Santa Claus parade

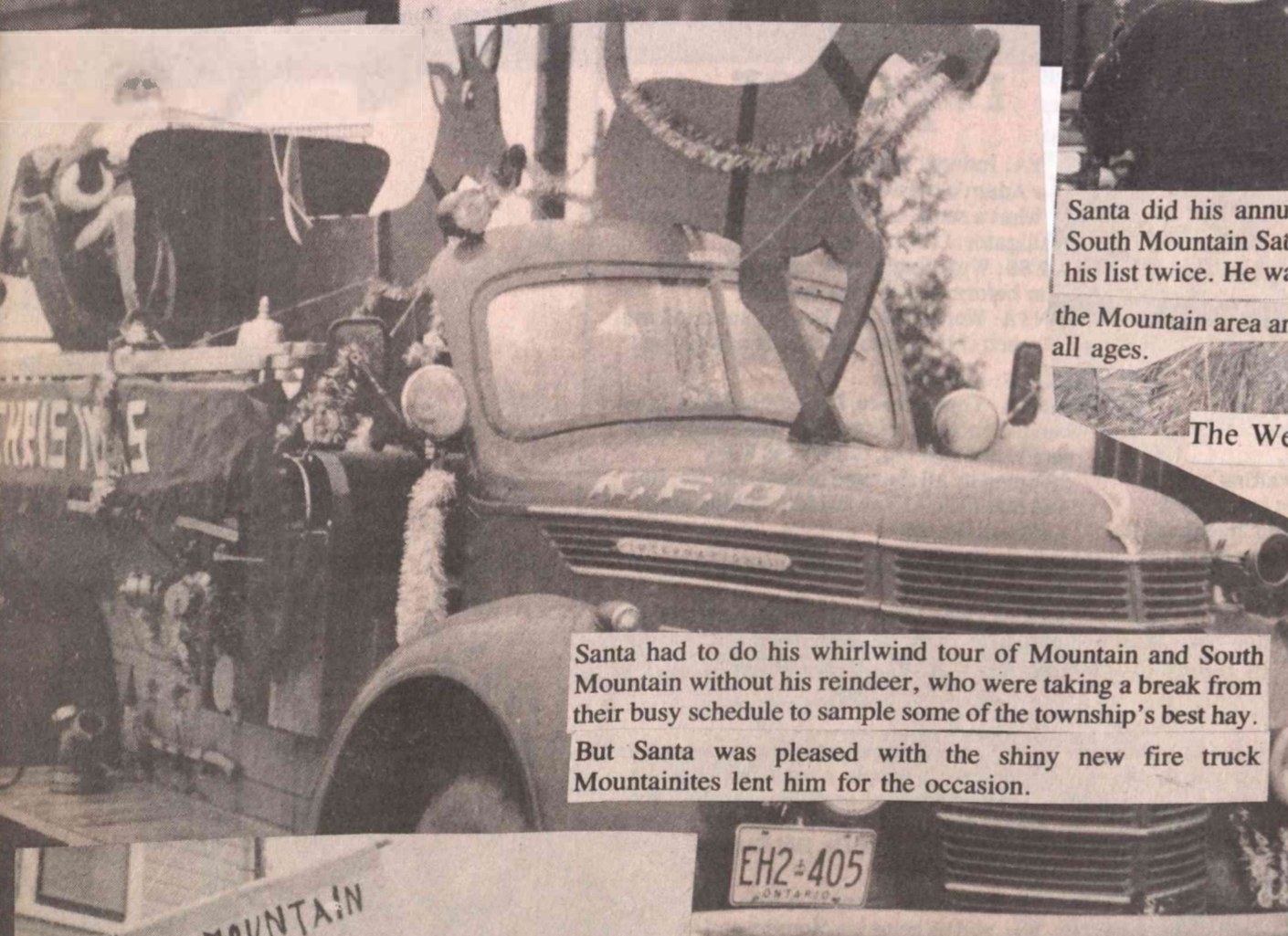
