Dear Sir Arthur: Some two months ago there was sent to you a copy of "Vocational Guidance in Engineering Lines," which you were so kind as to endorse in advance. You may remember that I had a talk with you one night in New York about McGill University undertaking to bring this book to the attention of high school students and other preparatory school students throughout Canada. At that time the conditions about publishing were quite different from those that developed later.
