Item, That a rich litter be ready to receive and convey the faid HENRY Princess to the west door of the church of St. Paul's.

Item, That three horsemen in side-saddle and harness, all of one fuit, be arrayed by the Master of the Queen's Horse, to follow next to the said Princess's litter.

Item, That a fair palfrey with a pillion, richly arrayed, and led in hand, for the faid Princess, do follow next unto the said Horsemen.

Item, That II palfreys in one suit, be ordained for such Ladies, attending upon the faid Princess, as shall follow next unto the faid pillion.

Item, That 5 charres diversely apparrelled for the Ladies and Gentlewomen, be ready the same time at the said Tower, whereof, one of the chief must be richly apparrelled and garnished for the faid Princess, and the other four to serve such Ladies as shall be appointed by the Queen's Chamberlain, and that the same follow in such order as the said Chamberlain shall appoint.

Item, That betwixt every of the faid charres, there be 5 or 6 palfreys of fuch Ladies, as shall come to the feast, for the attendance given upon the Queen's Grace.

Item, That the same Chamberlain have also the ordering of the faid palfreys, as well as of the charres, and if there fortune any more charges to come than above is affigued, then the fame to be ordered by the faid Chamberlain.

Item, It is to be remembred, that some wise and expert person or persons be assigned by the King and the Queen for the purveyance of the faid litter, palfreys, charges, and the apparels that shall be necessary for the same, and that this be done with all speed, for the case it requireth.

Item, That the Mayor, Citizens and Crafts attend upon the faid Princess at the Cross in Cheap, in such manner, and in such solemn pageants and ceremonies as they have devised for the honor of
