THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL SD-191.

An Act for the relief of Patricia Cotton.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Patricia Cotton, residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, wife of Ross Gilbert Hamilton Cotton, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the said city, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the seventeenth day of November, 5 A.D. 1951, at the said city, she then being Patricia White; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, on the ground of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that 10 the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved. **1.** The said marriage is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes 15 whatsoever.
