[31] INSTRUCTIONS

For the Captains of Militia when His Majesty's Forces are upon the March, or go into Quar-

ters in the different Parishes.

HE Quarters of the Troops will be fixed by the Captains of the Militia for Officers and Soldiers, in such a manner as to facilitate the March of the Troops, and the Ease of the Inhabitants.

II. The Quarters, once settled, shall not be changed, without the Knowledge of the

Captains of Militia.

III. The Carriages of Provisions, Ammunition, and other King's Stores, shall be paid at the Rate of Seven-pence half-penny Currency per League in Ready Money, and that from the Spot where the Loading has been taken in to the place where it is laid down.

IV. When the Troops march, the Officer commanding a Regiment or Battalion, may require two Carriages for himself, two for the Staff, and four for each Company, which shall be paid at the above-mentioned Rate: if more are demanded, they are to be furnished, on paying for this surplusage of Carriages at the Rate of One Shilling Currency per League.

V. These Carriages are to carry from Four Hundred and Fifty to Six Hundred weight each, if the state of the Roads allows thereof.
