

- § 18. Irregularity in attendance at Chapel and at Lectures renders any Student liable to the loss of his Term, at the discretion of the Corporation.

SCHOLARSHIPS.

- § 19. The four Foundation Scholarships shall be tenable for one year only; but it shall be in the power of the Corporation to continue his Foundation Scholarship to any student who, having failed to gain another Scholarship at the end of the First or Second year, shall be reported by the Examiners to be specially deserving.
- § 20. Instead of three Allan Scholarships of £30 each, as heretofore, there shall be two of £45 each (subject to the Founder's approval.)
- § 21. At the end of the First and Second Years there shall be awarded according to the result of the College Examination,

- each tenable for one year.
- § 22. At the end of the Third Year the Bishop Strachan Scholarship and the remaining Dickson Scholarship shall be awarded to Honour-men in Classics or Mathematics, in order of merit, but conditionally; that is to say, the stipends shall not be paid to the successful candidates unless they shall pass the examination for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts in the following term, and shall obtain a Class in Honours.
- § 23. These regulations respecting Scholarships shall take effect only in the case of Students entering in or after October, 1864.
