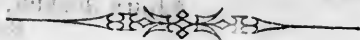

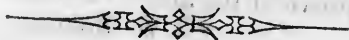

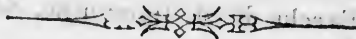
DEAR BRO. ALEXIUS:
