## Winning Owners, Jockeys And Trainers in England

London, Dec. 1.—The Houghton meeting at Newmarket brought the English flat racing season of 1918 to a close. The fifth season held under war conditions was remarkable in many respects, and for the first time on record a lady heads the list of winning owners. The distinction belongs to Lady James Douglas, who, thanks chiefly to her triple crown hero, Gainsborough, is credited with \$78,715 as the result of five races won. Solly Jack, whose horses won 21 races, is second with \$48,825; W. M. Gazale (12 races) with \$37,250, and A. W. Cox (10 races) with \$37,250. Lord Derby is next with \$37,250, and A. W. New York, Dec. 2.—Dick O'Brien, who twenty years ago was one of the leading middleweights of the country, died recently at his home in Lewiston, Me. During his ring career he fought such names as Joe Walcott, Mysterious Billy Smith, Dan Creedon, Kid McCoy, Jack Twin Sullivan and Sandy Ferguson. O'Brien, like many others who have gained fame in the squared circle, began his career in a Boston ring. He was considered the best middleweight in the country until he met Walcott.
