Lima, Peru, July 4.—A revolution broke out here at 3 o'clock this morning. President Pardo and the members of his cabinet were imprisoned.

Requests for additional information concerning the reported outbreak of revolution in Lima brought no further details, and in fact failed to corroborate the message from Peru.

Boston, July 4.—The Newspaper Writers' Union of this city voted unanimously yesterday to go on strike unless their demands for wage increases and recognition of the union are granted.

London, Ont., July 4.—William Merkle, a well-known dairyman living near Eastwood, was cut to pieces by the fast east-bound Grand Trunk Express early this morning while crossing the tracks at Eastwood station.

AUSTRIAN PRINCE SEEKS SEPARATION

London, July 4.—Prince Otto Windschgratz has filed a separation bill in the divorce court against his wife, the former Archduchess Elizabeth, according to a despatch to the Exchange Telegraph Co. from Vienna.

BRAZIL TO REPATRIATE GERMANY'S SAILORS

Rio Janeiro, July 4.—The government has decided to repatriate German sailors from interned vessels. The men will be returned to Germany on steamers of a Brazilian line.

Indian Boy, Guilty of Killing, Receives 15-Year Jail Term

Winnipeg, July 4.—John William Cochran, the 15-year-old Indian boy, who on June 25 last was found guilty of manslaughter of his employer, James R. Campbell, a farmer of Rockwood, Man., with a long two-pronged fork on April 13, was sentenced to the penitentiary by Mr. Justice Frensdorff for 15 years yesterday afternoon.

SAYS BRITISH LABOR MAY TAKE A HAND

G. Cascaden of Windsor Gives Warning to Dominion Government.

Windsor, July 4.—Declaring that Hon. Arthur Meighen, minister of the interior, Senator Robertson, minister of labor, and other politicians are endeavoring to "railroad" Winnipeg general strike leaders to prison on trumped-up charges, Gordon Cascaden, well-known in Detroit and Windsor for British and United States publications, said Friday that organized labor overseas will now take a hand in this struggle for democracy in Canadian industry.

TO ERECT MONUMENT TO DEAD U. S. SOLDIERS

Paris, July 4.—A monument to the American soldiers who perished in France will be erected in May next year, at the tomb of Lafayette, in the Pichus Cemetery. This announcement was made by Andre Tardieu at the close of the American tribute to Lafayette, said today, the 4th of July, when Hugh C. Wallace, the American minister to France, laid a wreath on the tomb of the French hero. Mr. Tardieu said that the sculptor, Bartholomew, had been entrusted with the designing of the monument.
