One of Hon. Clifford Sifton's Provinces of Canada's Next Five Years.

Hon. Clifford Sifton spoke for half an hour at the Canadian Club luncheon yesterday upon the undeveloped resources of Canada and the possibilities of the next five years.

The most important national event in the next five years, said Mr. Sifton, would no doubt be the entire incorporation of the two new provinces into confederation of the Dominion on July 1—Alberta and Saskatchewan.

Next in importance was the subject of proper manufacture of steel in the Dominion. This was necessary to give an impetus to development.

Before the G.T.P. Railway was completed it was most probable that a line would be run from the northeastern part of the Northwest to Hudson Bay.
