



It will be remembered that a year or so ago the allegation was made that Vanzant fad operated under an assumed name in the Elgin elections, to the detriment of the Conservative

DENOMINATIONAL STATISTICS Figures Which Have Been Prepared

by Administration Committee. Some interesting statistics were present ed to the sub-committee on church admin istration, which met yesterday in the Metistration, which met yesterday in the Metropolitan Church, as a preliminary to the joint conference on church union, which opens to-day. The committee has found the total of ordained ministers in Canada to be: Presbyterian, 1506; Methodist, 1790; Congregational, 105. Of the above numbers there are 1231 Presbyterian ministers in charge of settled parishes and over missions; 1400 Methodists and 84 Congregationalists. The Presbyterian Church has 41 ministers engaged as professors and in connection with religious journalism, or in charge of the various agencies in connection with the church; the Methodists 52 and the Congregationalists 4. There are 12 colleges under the direction of the Methodist Church and 6 under the Presbyterian.

The Methodist Church contains three departments which the others have not as yet taken up, namely, deaconess' work, a book room and publishing house, and the department of temperance and moral reform.

PRIMATE ELECTION LATER.

Defer the Ceremony.

It is not likely that the appointment of the primate of all Canada will fall upon the same day as the appointment of the archbishop of the ecclesiastical province, as was at first anticipated by the ruling elements of the Canadian Anglican Church. Jan. 16 is the date set for the meeting an, 16 is the date set for the meeting of bishops of the Canadian Province, when a successor to the late Archbishop Bond will be appointed in the person of his lordship Bishop Arthur Sweatman. It was thought that the bishops of the Province of Rupertsland and western dioceses could be assembled at the same time for the appointment of primary but word has been pointment of prima, but word has been received at the synod office that Archbishop Matheson cannot be present at that date. The archbishop has stated, further, that a number of the bishops in his province will be abroad at that season, and, as there is no provision whereby voting can be done by prays, the appointment can be done by proxy, the appointment of primate must be deferred.
