JAMES STREET EXTENSION

Board of Works Vote Against Re-Opening the Matter-Tax Sale Judgment Hits Hard.

The decision of the civic works mittee yesterday against repealing the bylaw providing for James-street xtension at a width of 66 feet means that the question will not be re-open-ed by the city, and that the ruling of Judge Winchester as to the assessable area and the basis of assessment in individual cases will set the final seal upon the undertaking. Now that the committee has set

The right to petition was granted, that an expression of the will of the city might be obtained. The evidence had all been adduced, and his honor hopes next week to be able to give his ruling.

Should Justice MacMahon's decision allowing John Russell to redeem Caraw-avenue property from the city, be accepted as a final judgment, the city liable to be sued for the recovery of no less than 1657 parcels of land pur chased from the city at tax sales. The accumulated taxes amount to about 525,000. The city bought these parcels under a provision of the assessment act, whereby a municipality might pur-chase lands for the amount of taxes due, provided the price offered at an adjourned sale was less than the amount of arrears of taxes, charges and costs, and provided also that the sale was duly advertised. The judge's lecision was based on the fact that he city did not advertise each partiular lot it intended to purchase. What further complicates the situation is the fact that the city has sold four acres of the property to Clark & Clark. The price paid was \$16,000. 
