The motion, seconded by Mr. Fraser, provided that on and after January, 1899, pupils attending the Toronto Collegiate Institutes may have the following options in the first and second forms, or the first, second or third grades: Pupils taking English and commercial subjects only shall pay a fee of \$5 annually; with English and commercial and one language, \$9; do, and two languages, \$13; three languages, \$16; summing up to the present fee in existence. In the third grade (a) pupils taking English and commercial subjects, \$5; with (a) and one language, \$11; with (a) and two languages, \$17; with (a) and three or more languages, \$23 as far as the primary departmental examination. The pupils will thus be able to take science or botany to prepare for their primary. It was referred to the Managing Committee.
