

Editor World: I have just read in a copy of The Toronto World of May 24th, sent me by a Canadian friend, a poem, signed "Tocsa," in which the Lords and Commons of the British Parliament are held up to scorn for "arrogating" to themselves the title of "Imperial Parliament." In justice to the twelve hundred Lords and Commoners, the representatives of 40 million people, to whom the burden of administering the general affairs of the Empire has been tacitly left during the past hundred years, may I have leave to point out to your readers that "Tocsa's" indignation is founded upon a complete misapprehension.

The official title of the Parliament which sits at Westminster is "The Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland." No other title is used by that Parliament.

It is not the "Imperial Parliament"; and I may observe that the funds which it administers, very largely for the benefit of the other countries of the Empire, are not Imperial funds, but are raised from the taxpayers of the United Kingdom.

There is no such body as an Imperial Parliament in the British Empire; that there should be is the aim and object of all those who are working for Imperial Pederation.

That the name "Imperial Parliament" has come, of late years, to be applied to the Parliament of the United Kingdom is true; but I think "Tocsa" will find, if he cares to investigate, that the term is of colonial, not British origin.
