Hepworth, Ont., Sept. 23.-The attention of the Grey and Bruce Oil and Gas Comof the Grey and Bruce Oil and Gas Company and the public has been directed to No. 2 gas well, capacity 500,000 cubic feet per day. To-day it was incidentally discovered by two of the company that oil was blowing out of well No. 1 in the village of Hepworth, this being forced up by the volume of gas. Upon another examination it was discovered that the well was filling up with oil and salt water to a depth of 400 feet. A pump will be put in to test as to its output of oil. It promises to be a great producer, so far as can be ascertained at present. The oil is of a very superfor quality, and its discovery has created quite a stir in this locality.
